Cascaglia School was founded in the 1870s by two young Cornell University professors, Lucien August Waite (1846-1913), who taught mathematics and Bela. Makun (1840-99), who taught Latin and German. They set up a tutoring school for Cornell students as well as for those who planned to enter Cornell and found it in Cascaglia Place, still part of Cornell's campus and now known as Cascaglia Hall. Both the school and this early Cornell building take their name from nearby Cascadilla Creek, a cascading spanish for little cascades. After McCon left Cornell, Waite started The Cascade School in 1890 as a full-fledged preparatory school for boys. Students from the U.S. came mostly from outside Ithaca and included Japanese, Cuban and other international students. The current school building (originally called Wait Hall) was also built in 1890 and designed by Ithaca architect William Henry Miller. In the 1890s, three more buildings for four classes for students between 60 and 90 students were built or purchased in the Summit area. The school supported many extracurricular activities, which ranged from student fraternities, mandolin clubs and literary magazines to inter-school sports, including football, basketball, baseball, tennis, gymnastics, cross-country and track. The Cascadilla team built a particularly strong reputation with the help of Cornell's legendary coach, Charles Courtney. The school maintained large sports fields and also built the Cascade Boathouse, still used as a Ithaca City boathouse today. The early graduates were Hermann M. Biggs, who led the fight in the United States against tuberculosis, Adolf Kors Jr. of the Coors Brewing Co. and John M. Olin, whose name adorns the Olin Library in Cornell. Lucien Waite devoted his life to the Cascade School, making most of his professor's salary in the development of the School. In 1910, Waite gave his school to a group of Ithaca businessmen who founded the Association of Cascading Schools in 1914. This group owned and operated a preparatory school for boys until 1925, when the school was reorganized and became a day school, preserving only today's school building. Clarence Doyle (1876-1947), a Cornell graduate and chemistry teacher at the school, took over the school and opened the current accelerated Cascadillo program, which emphasizes small classes with individual attention. The students also started admittedly in 1925. In 1946, just as G.I. Bill made both college and high school diploma available to returning World War II veterans, Maxwell Kendall (1909-89), who studied chemistry at Cornell, took over the ownership and functioning of the school from Doyle. Cascaville provided high school credit for many veterans in the 1960s and Kendall significantly expanded the school's campus by purchasing additional buildings for dormitories. School offers English as a second language also expanded significantly in the 1950s. In the 1970s, international students became up to a third of students, as Kendall's son, John, became the school's principal. Thus, the Kendall family has the greatest influence on the development of the school since Lucien Waite. John Kendall succeeded his wife, Patricia Kendall, the current headmistress in 2002. The stone was mined from the giant's stairs falling below the Central Avenue bridge. Medina stone has been used for quoins, strings, and window trim. The style of the Second Empire is evident in the corner pavilions and the roof of Mansard with dormitories. Albany architects Nichols and Brown had to adopt this style for Morrill Hall. The water treatment business failed and this building was impressed for university purposes. In the early years it housed students, teachers, administrative offices and canteens. The two-century Oriel window above the south entrance is a later improvement. A major overhaul in 1981 removed chimneys and added floor to the Mansard roof. Built in 1864, Cascadilla was acquired by Ezra Cornell as the university's first residence hall.
